



Academic Scholarship Program

PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM

The purpose of the scholarship program is to provide academic, pastoral and financial support to assist our highly capable, academic students in pursuing their unique God-given potential. We want to encourage our students to achieve the highest academic results possible, while pursuing areas of passion. As students pursue excellence in their field of endeavour, we will ensure that the needs of the student are met in every area of their school life.

Those students who receive scholarships will have exemplary character and will share the values of our College community. Selected students will exhibit qualities such as integrity, leadership, initiative, care and compassion for others, and personal responsibility.

ELIGIBILITY

Academic Scholarships are awarded to students of high academic ability on the basis of academic merit, as demonstrated in an academic portfolio and an interview. The academic portfolio will demonstrate accomplishments, a commitment to learning, and involvement in school activities. Applications are invited from students currently enrolled at the College, or students who have submitted an application for enrolment.

BENEFITS

Scholarships will cover a proportion of the tuition fees from Year 7 to Year 12, subject to annual review and renewed application every 2 years.

Benefits may include some or all of the following:

- Individual Education Plan
- School-based mentorship
- School based tutoring
- Individual pastoral support

SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT EXPECTATIONS

- Participation in College academic opportunities and/or competitions
- Act as mentors/tutors for other students who are showing academic potential
- Represent the College by speaking at special events

LENGTH AND TENURE OF SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarships will commence in Year 7, Year 9 and Year 11. Year 7 Academic Scholarships will continue to Year 8. Application can then be made for the scholarships to continue into Years 9 and 10, followed by application to continue into Years 11 and 12. Scholarships commencing in Year 11 will continue into Year 12.

All scholarships will be reviewed annually.



APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications are invited from current students and students not currently enrolled, who meet the selection criteria outlined in this application.

To apply for a scholarship, a student must be enrolled at the College, which means that an Application for Enrolment form has been submitted and payment of Application Fee has been processed. Please note the Application Fee for Enrolment is non-refundable.

Students must submit:

A cover letter that includes:

- a brief personal introduction
- an outline of how the academic scholarship will enhance their learning at SPCC
- a description of areas of interest and passion
- a personal reflection statement on the College Core Values.

A portfolio

This portfolio should include:

- Academic transcripts (reports) and awards (including external competitions)
- NAPLAN results
- Reference from a current teacher or mentor
- Evidence of participation in extra-curricular activities
- Previous class placements for academic pursuits
- Psychometric report (if available)

SELECTION PROCESS

The selection process will include:

- Review of Scholarship application
- Review of portfolio
- An invitation for selected applicants to interview with Principal/Scholarship Selection Committee

The Scholarship Selection Committee will select scholarship recipients based on the applicant's ability to best fulfil the selection criteria and school priority areas.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- High academic ability demonstrated through academic merit
- Strong teacher/mentor recommendation highlighting student's attitude to learning, passionate engagement, standard of behaviour and learning disposition
- Strong communication skills

MENTORING GROUPS

All students on scholarship will be involved in school-based mentoring groups throughout the year. This is an opportunity to set goals, receive support and give feedback on being a Scholarship Recipient at SPCC Newcastle.

SCHOLARSHIP REVIEW

A scholarship review will take place annually to assess if a scholarship recipient's achievement is consistent with the selection criteria.
