Our History

St Philip's Christian College commenced as a parish ministry in 1982 at St Philip's Anglican Church in the Newcastle suburb of Waratah. With two teachers and 41 students during the first year; the facilities were comprised of renovated areas of the parish halls.

The College became independent of the church in 1984 when St Philip's Christian Education Foundation Ltd was formed. The College family now encompasses six schools in Newcastle, Port Stephens, Cessnock and Gosford, and caters to over 4000 students from Pre-Kindergarten to Tertiary Learning, employing over 700 teaching and support staff.

PORT STEPHENS

The Port Stephens School was opened in 1995 through the vision of the founding school in Waratah and its Principal, Mr Graeme Irwin. The vision was based upon the belief that the Tomaree Peninsula had a need for an independent school that would develop the whole child – intellectually, socially, physically and spiritually; a school that would maintain high academic and behavioural standards, and at the same time effectively proclaim the liberating truth of the Christian Gospel.

Under the leadership of the founding Principal, Mr Chris Walkling, classes commenced on the 1st February, 1995 with 41 students from Kindergarten to Year 6. Embraced by the local community, the school grew rapidly and in 1998 moved into secondary education with the establishment of a Year 7 cohort.

In 2002 our first group of School Certificate students graduated and in 2004 our first HSC students were awarded their certificates, with outstanding results across a wide range of subject areas.

The College has become renowned for its safe and nurturing environment and strong academic results. It currently enjoys enrolments over 750 students.

- Setting high professional standards in all aspects of College life.
- Fulfilling any reasonable request made by the Principal or Deputy Principal, performing it to the best of their ability, with a high level of professionalism.
