Entertainment offers training opportunities to students who are interested in performance and events: dance and drama, lighting and sound, staging and set design and dealing with patrons and professionals.

This course is based on units of competency, which have been developed by the entertainment industry to describe the competencies, skills and knowledge required by workers in the industry.

Working in the Entertainment industry involves:

- lighting and sounds operations
- staging & stage management
- front of house activities
- set and props manufacture
- audiovisual operations
- costume design
- makeup
- scenic art

HSC Examination

An external written Higher School Certificate examination will be conducted for this course. This examination is optional. During the year students complete the 240 hour course, students will specify whether or not they choose to undertake the external written examination.

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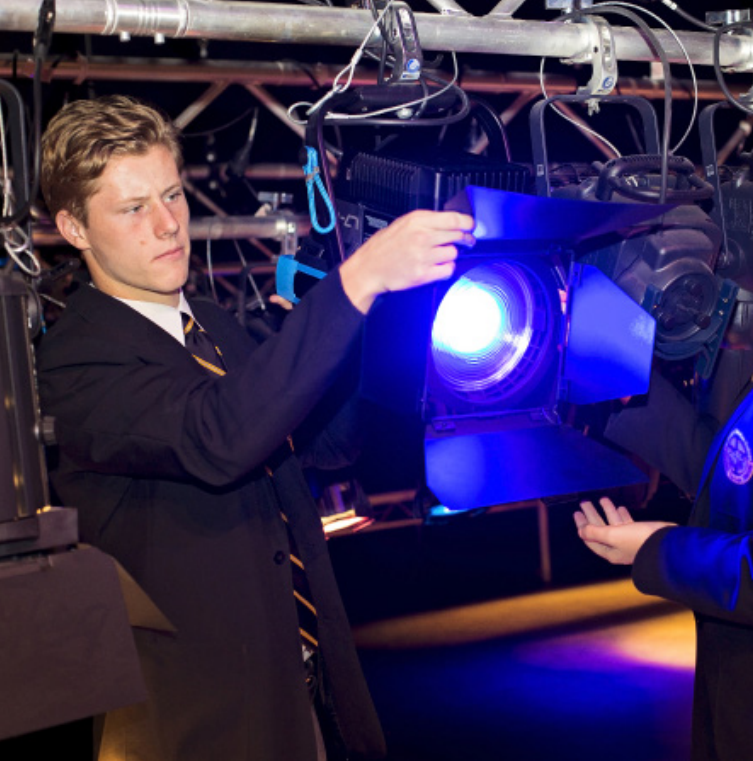

Entertainment Industry is a Vocational Education and Training (VET) course, delivered to Yr 11 and 12 students.

Successful completion of the course requires students to demonstrate a range of essential skills to industry standard. Classes consist of both theory and practical activities incorporating a range of industry related skills and environments.

Occupations that require skills in this area include:

- sales/merchandising assistant
- lighting technician
- sound technician
- dresser or costume assistant
- scenic artist
- cinema projectionist
- set maker
- props designer

Work Placement

Students must also complete 70 hours of workplace training in an industry related environment.

- A nationally recognised qualification: CUA30415 Certificate III in Live Production and Services
- Accreditation for your HSC
- Accreditation for your ATAR
- A **67 University Entry Rank** for the University of Newcastle
- A start on the pathway to a diploma or degree
- Entry level jobs
