The Certificate III in Visual Arts is a way to begin your training as a visual artist. This qualification will equip you with the core skills needed to work in both the creative industries and in corporate settings. Creativity, critical thinking, visual communication and problem-solving will be some of the most desired attributes in the job market in the future. Through this course you will develop your skills to work across a number of visual arts mediums and gain the foundational knowledge needed to undertake further study in the visual arts field and other creative areas.

Throughout this course you will develop practical skills and knowledge to explore the use of colour, use visual components to communicate ideas, and develop critical thinking techniques. You will explore a range of artmaking mediums including drawing, painting, sculpture, ceramics, printmaking and more.

You will graduate from this course with the knowledge and confidence to make appropriate decisions regarding your future in arts roles such as:

- Painter (Visual Arts)
- Sculptor

The Certificate III in Visual Arts is a Vocational Education and Training (VET) course, delivered to Year 11 and 12 students. The course is worth 2 Preliminary Units and 2 HSC Units. This course does not count towards the ATAR.
